Please be advised that the City of Burlington objects to the application by St Mary's Cement Inc (Canada) for a Class A Quarry license under the Aggregate Resources Act on Part of Lots 1, 2 and 3 Concession 11 in the City of Hamilton (former township of East Flamborough).

The basis for the City of Burlington's objection is that the Haul Route Environmental Assessment and the Combined Agency Review Team final report are not complete and thus various technical and planning matters that the City has an interest in remain outstanding. While city planning staff will continue to participate in both the Environmental Assessment and the Combined Agency Review Team processes it is not possible for the City at this time to determine how or if it is impacted by the application.
