
Situation Summary

- Lowndes Holdings Corp. assembled two blocks of land on the 11th Concession in Flamborough:
 - 380 Acres Lots 2 & 3 and parts of Lot 1
 - 154 Acres south parts of Lots 4 & 5
 - Planned to establish a Limestone Quarry
- Submitted an application to the City of Hamilton in September 2004 for Official Plan and Zoning By-law changes
- No ARA licence application has been made to the Province
- St Marys Cement purchased Lowndes Holdings Corp. in June of 2006


This application must be denied!


- Surrounded by Existing Rural Communities

- Existing Legislation Provides the Criteria


No Reasonable Person would approve this Quarry!
















What needs to be said...

- Scale of this Proposal is Huge!
 - 170 Acre Crater up to 38 Meters Deep,
 - a peak of 1140 Truck Trips per day,
 - up to 3.6 Million Gallons of Water per day,
 - 25 to 30 Year Operational Lifespan
- 150 Acres more not in the applications
- 3rd Largest Quarry Operation in Ontario

It would change our Communities forever!


The Third Year of our Fight!

- Highlights of the Past 12 Months:
 - Fantastic Public Meetings in the Spring of 2006
 - Overwhelming United Community Opposition
 - Lowndes Holding Corp gave up and sold out!
 - We should be very proud, we won round one!
 - St Marys purchases Lowndes in June 2006
 - Aggressive public relations campaign
 - They received strong fact based negative feedback
 - To date no updates on any of the application details or technical studies

Current Status Update


- Groundwater Recirculation System Testing
 - St Marys wants to test the proposed GRS
 - Required a Permit to Take Water (PTTW)
 - Applied in October 2006
 - 2.8 Million gallons per day
 - Carlisle is licensed for only 950,000 gallons per day
 - MOE received approximately 600 submissions
 - Have asked St Marys for more information
 - Have indicated that addition information will be required once the 600 submission are reviewed!

Groundwater Recirculation




Transportation Study

- Requirements issued in April 2006
- St Marys has been contesting the TOR
- Borehole work done without permission
- Process requires four (4) Public Meetings to be held

Legislative / Regulatory Update

- The regulatory environment improves:
 - Province showing commitment to the Greenbelt
 - Additional lands, permanence of easements, etc.
 - Clean Water Act
 - Critical piece of legislation post Walkerton
 - Already passed and now being implemented
 - Endangered Species Act
 - Long overdue update to this regulatory framework
 - Pass 2nd Reading and is before Committee
 - Hamilton Rural Official Plan
 - Acknowledgement of outdated aggregate information
 - 2007 Hamilton Budget includes funds to address

- The timing is really up to St Marys:
 - Need to complete their studies / reports
 - Could decide to not wait for a City decision
 - Could put the whole project on hold
