FORCE adds muscle to its roster

Perhaps one of the strongest citizen advocacy groups ever created in these parts, FORCE is not content to rest on its laurels.

FORCE (Friends of Rural Communities and the Environment) sprung up several years back, made up of northern Flamborough residents, all with a single goal in mind - to stop the St Marys quarry application.

As FORCE vice-chair Mark Rudolph noted to the Compass, "Most citizens' group hold bake sales and the like to raise funds and then scream and yell a lot. We're a little more than that."

Indeed, since their creation in May 2004, the group has raised over \$500,000, all earmarked to fighting the St Marys' quarry application.

On hot on the heels of St Marys' announcement that their public notification and consultation period was initiated on April 3, FORCE came back with a little announcement of their own.

The group had created a Blue Ribbon Strategic Advisory Panel, filled with four environmental heavyweights, all enlisted to support their cause.

The inaugural members of the strategic advisory group are: Dr. Alba DiCenso, a professor in the Department of Clinical

Epidemiology and Biostatistics and the School of Nursing at McMaster University; Jacques Gérin, the former Federal Deputy Minister of Environment and Associate Deputy Minister of Northern Affairs and Chair of the Panel on the Ecological Integrity of Canada's National Parks; Monte Hummel, President Emeritus, World Wildlife Fund Canada and Dr. Gail Krantzberg, a professor and Director of the Dofasco Centre for Engineering & Public Policy in the School of Engineering at McMaster University.

The members of the panel were known as either friends or acquaintances of FORCE members, acknowledged Rudolph.

"They all know this area and they've all seen this saga unfold for a while now," he noted. "They were happy to lend their expertise to the cause."

Rudolph noted, "we believe they will lend a lot of weight to the cause."

"FORCE has always been a group of substance. Now we're a group with even more substance."

"We are extremely fortunate to have this esteemed group assisting our community to oppose St Marys Cement's quarry applications," said Graham Flint, Chair of FORCE, in a newsletter. "Their fields of expertise dovetail with key objections in our community case against the proposed open pit mine. Collectively, we are determined to protect the environment, water, and public health in this part of Ontario's Greenbelt."

Flint noted that Hamilton's public health services department has already raised concerns to the Ministry of the Environment about the risk to underground water supplying the Carlisle area.

Since the quarry is on the Flamborough-Campbellville border at 11 Concession Road East, Halton Medical Officer of Health Dr. Bob Nosal also wrote to the Ministry of natural resources, expressing concerns about well water across the regional boundary.
