


The Proposal

- West of Milburough Line, north of Concession 11 East
- Dolostone quarry on 154 ha / 380 ac
- Extraction limit: ±68 ha (168 ac)
- Access to be determined, up to approx. 570 trucks in each direction
- Processing facilities on site
- End use is a lake excavation area would fill with water




Location

Required Approvals

- Aggregate Resources Act: not yet submitted to Province or circulated.
- Planning Act: Amendment to Flamborough Official Plan and Zoning By-law
- Technical approvals including Permit to Take Water
- Process under Environmental Assessment Act for haul route selection, road improvements



Regulatory/Policy Framework

- Aggregate Resources Act: Ontario Aggregate Standards
- Planning Act: Provincial Policy Statements, Hamilton – Wentworth and Flamborough Official Plans and ZBL
- Greenbelt Plan
- Environmental Protection Act and Ontario Water Resources Act: air quality, noise, water standards
- Environmental Assessment Act: Municipal Class EA




Who Decides?

- Planning Act: City of Hamilton
- Water, Air and Noise: Ministry of the Environment
- Aggregate Resources Act Licence: Minister of Natural Resources
- Prospect of some decisions going to the Ontario Municipal Board if applications are appealed or referred

Status and Concerns: Hydrogeology

- Hydrogeological report submitted July 2005, reviewed by CART and other agencies. Concerns include:
 - More information needed
 - Premature findings
 - Errors and inconsistencies
- Lowndes consultants generating new work plan for review by Hamilton and CART.



Status and Concerns: Natural Heritage

- Prelim. Level 2 Natural Environment Report and TOR for further work peer reviewed
 - Significant wetlands
 - Significant woodlands
 - Significant valleylands
 - Significant wildlife habitat
 - Significant portions of habitat for rare and endangered species
 - Fish habitat
 - ANSI and ESA



Natural Heritage Level 2

- Draft Environmental Impact
 Statement and Level 2 Natural
 Environment Report released
 February 2006, being reviewed by
 CART
- Key issues relate to protection of wetlands and woodlands, and fish habitat.
- Groundwater / wetland interaction

Status and Concerns: Traffic

- Terms of Reference being provided to Lowndes for further work.
 Concerns and issues include:
 - Level of detail
 - Road user safety
 - Compatibility and acceptability
 - Greenbelt Plan
 - Environmental Assessment requirements
 - Inter jurisdictional issues
 - Capital and maintenance costs



Status and Concerns: Noise and Vibration

- Preliminary material peer reviewed – to be supplemented when site plan design is developed. Concerns include:
 - Noise levels to residences from site operations
 - Truck traffic noise, including early morning queuing




Quarry Site Plan

- New site plan to be prepared under the Aggregate Resources Act as part of Licence application
- Plan will reflect study findings
- Municipal role within the Site Plan area is limited
- Separate public process for aggregate licence
- Application would be considered by the Minister of Natural Resources

- Finalize technical studies
- Complete CART and agency review
- Present preliminary CART findings at public information meeting(s)
- City staff report to Council
- Statutory Public Meeting, Council decision on Planning Act applications, comment on ARA application
- Other CART participants develop independent positions
- Prospect of Ontario Municipal Board hearing
- If approved, EA and technical approval requirements to be met.
